FOUNDATIONAL VIOLENCE RISK ASSESSMENT AND MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP

Protect International is pleased to present a 5-Day Foundational Violence Risk Assessment and Management Workshop in partnership with University of Waterloo. The workshop is taking place between 26 to 30 November 2018 in Waterloo, Ontario.

This workshop will provide an opportunity to learn new skills and build on existing skills in assessing and managing risk for violence. Not only will you learn about general violence risk assessment and management principles focusing on the most common forms of violence, but also about best practices supported by researchers and practitioners around the world. Successful completion will be recognized with a certificate.

The specific tools you will learn to administer include the new versions of the HCR-20 and SARA, as well as the B-SAFER and SAM. All of these tools are structured and evidence-based and amongst the most widely used procedures for assessing and managing violence risk.

Thousands of professionals from hundreds of settings across the world have taken part in our workshops to date and the procedures developed by our Threat Assessment Specialists are among the most widely used in the field. Workshop Overview

DAY 1

Violence triage and implementation issues

- Focuses on triaging for violence risk to determine when comprehensive assessment is necessary
- Focuses on legal issues (e.g., human rights, privacy and information sharing, occupational health and safety)
- Focuses on risk communication (e.g., purpose, format, and content of written and oral reports)

DAY 2

Principles of violence risk assessment and management

- The nature of violence and violence risk
- Principles of violence risk assessment, focusing on structured professional judgment (SPJ) approaches
- Principles of violence risk management, focusing on scenario planning approaches

DAY 3

Assessing and managing risk for general violence

- Focuses on general or “typical” violence, including that committed by people with mental health, personality, or substance use problems
- Includes administration of the Historical-Clinical-Risk-Management-20 Version 3 (HCR-20 V3)

DAY 4

Assessing and managing risk for intimate partner violence

- Focuses on violence against current or former intimate partners, one of the most common and dangerous forms of violence
- Includes administration of the Spousal Assault Risk Assessment Guide Version 3 (SARA-V3) and the Brief Spousal Assault Form for the Evaluation of Risk (B-SAFER)

DAY 5

Assessing and managing risk for stalking

- Focuses on unwanted contact and communication, including physical violence, by people who are angry or obsessed
- Includes administration of the Guidelines for Stalking Assessment and Management (SAM)

Daily Schedule

The workshop runs from 0900 to 1630 each day, with refreshment breaks in the morning and afternoon and a lunch break from 1200 to 1300. Registration is from 0830 to 0900 on the first day of the workshop.

WORKSHOP INSTRUCTORS

Their work focuses on conducting assessments, providing training, and developing, implementing and evaluating strategies related to preventing, assessing, and managing violence. Specifically, the instructors specialize in risk for various forms of violence including general violence, intimate partner violence, stalking, sexual violence, honour-based violence, elder abuse, and group-based violence.

The instructors have received numerous awards for their work in this area and combined have co-authored more than 1,250 articles, chapters, books, manuals, and presentations, and conducted more than 850 workshops around the world.
