## SELF-DIRECTED VIOLENCE WORKSHOP

Protect International is pleased to present a 2-Day Self-Directed Violence Workshop in partnership with Fleming College. The workshop is taking place between 21-22 October 2019 in Peterborough, Ontario.

This workshop will provide an opportunity to learn new skills and build on existing skills in assessing and managing risk for self-directed violence. In recent years, there has been an emphasis on the importance of using structured methods that incorporate clinical judgment and evidence-based guidelines to assess and manage risk for self-directed violence rather than relying solely on clinical judgment, basic checklists, or actuarial methods.

During the 2-Day Workshop, participants will learn about general principles of risk assessment and management and the use of the Self-Directed Violence-20 (SDV-20) for assessing and managing risk for self-directed violence. The SDV-20 is a set of guidelines for comprehensive assessment and management of self-directed violence developed according to the Structured Professional Judgment (SPJ) model. It is based on research, supported by best practice, and acceptable in a court of law. Successful completion will be recognized with a certificate of completion for each participant.
