How to Assess and Manage Risk for Hate Crimes (13 February 2024)

Hate crime, which ranges from intimidating communications up to homicide or even mass homicide, has been escalating around the world. This workshop will cover: 1) the definition, nature, and prevalence of hate crimes, and 2) special issues related to threat assessment and management.

How to Assess and Manage Risk for Group-Based Violence (12 March 2024)

Group-based violence, including organized crime and gang violence, is a complex and serious international problem. This workshop will cover: 1) the definition, nature, and prevalence of group-based violence, and 2) special issues related to threat assessment and management.

Case Formulation in Violence Risk Assessment (14 May 2024)

If professionals do not understand why an individual perpetrated violence in the past, it is difficult or impossible to prevent violence in the future. This workshop will cover: 1) action theory as the framework that underlies structured professional judgment, and 2) the implications of using action theory for case formulation when assessing and managing violence risk.

Scenario Planning in Violence Risk Assessment (11 June 2024)

The stories you tell about how violence may occur, are the stories that will help you to prevent it. This workshop will cover: 1) scenario planning as a framework that underlies structured professional judgment, and 2) the implications of using scenario planning to forecast possible violent futures and build management plans to prevent those futures.

Considering Culture and Violence Risk (17 September 2024)

Although there is a great appreciation that culture influences violence in many ways, there is limited understanding of how professionals should consider culture when assessing and managing violence in specific cases. This workshop will cover: 1) critical research and theory on cross-cultural aspects of violence risk, and 2) an analytical framework that can and should be used in every case.

Managing Fear and Violence Risk (15 October 2024)

Managing the fear experience by potential victims of violence is an important and often overlooked task when conducting threat assessments. This workshop will cover: 1) the nature of fear and the implication for risk and safety, and 2) strategies for managing fear and supporting victims.
